Fidelity Checklist

Strategy 1: Behavior Specific Praise

BSP occurs when a teacher gives a student(s) specific and positive verbal feedback that encourages or approves an academic, functional, or social behavior. When delivering BSP, a teacher must describe the behavior with specific terms and offer a positive praise statement. There are 5 steps to implementing BSP: gaining the student's attention, identifying the behavior, delivering praise, maintaining neutral/positive affect and giving 3 seconds of wait time.

Upon using BSP in the classroom, complete the following fidelity checklist. One checklist corresponds to one use of the strategy. After using the strategy, take a few moments to reflect on your use of the strategy and record your responses accordingly.
